**Re:** EPPC Scholar Comment for Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) Meeting, November 2-3, 2021, Docket No. CDC-2021-0112

Dear Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices:

My name is Rachel Morrison. I am an attorney and policy analyst at the Ethics and Public Policy Center (EPPC), where I work on EPPC's HHS Accountability Project. Thank you for the opportunity to provide written public comment to ACIP.

As you know, vaccines are important medical interventions to combat diseases. As such, ACIP should be looking for ways to provide access to every person in the U.S. who wishes to be vaccinated as a matter of public health. There is, however, one group that has been marginalized, discriminated against, and overlooked in the U.S.'s vaccination programs. That group is those who wish to vaccinate but cannot because they hold sincere religious or conscience objections to receiving vaccines that have connections to aborted fetal cell lines.<sup>1</sup>

Unfortunately, several of the most common vaccines in the U.S. were produced or tested using aborted fetal cell lines.<sup>2</sup> This includes *all* vaccines available in the U.S. for COVID-19, as well as for Hepatitis A, Rubella (MMR), and Chickenpox.<sup>3</sup>

Earlier this year HHS year took steps to provide access to some of these vaccines for those who have religious and conscience objections, yet still wish to be vaccinated against serious diseases, by allowing importation of versions of the vaccine manufactured abroad that are

untainted by abortion. Specifically, after HHS received complaints from health care providers and patients, it created an exception to the Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act's bar on importing certain non-FDA-licensed vaccines for Measles, Rubella, and Hepatitis A because the ban "substantially burden[ed] their exercise of religion in violation of the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA)."<sup>4</sup>

I urge ACIP to consider ways to incentivize, procure, and require production of vaccines that do not have connections to aborted fetal cell lines so that *everyone* in the U.S. that desires a vaccine to prevent serious disease in themselves and others can receive one without violating their conscience or religious beliefs. Certainly, this administration's commitment to equity for religious minorities<sup>5</sup> and widespread vaccination requires nothing less.
